SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I sure can. For the certified general appraiser's license, you would...it would be required to have a bachelor's degree or 30 hours of classroom...not classroom, credit hours of higher education in a specific given course of study, which you'll find defined on your handout. And with the licenses that previously are below the certified general, would require an associate's degree, or 21 hours of college credit hours, would be in lieu of the degree.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. In a specific degree, or just a degree?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: A degree.

SENATOR SMITH: So it could be in psychology or appraisal or nursing?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Correct.
