SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. My time may be running, but I'm going to have a bit of consultation.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, how much time do I have left?

SENATOR CUDABACK: You used about one and a half minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I assure you that it was...that one and a half minute was a period of time well used.
