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the changes made "by" the bill, would be more appropriate than saying, made "in" the bill. By the same token, when we drop down to line 11, I believe it would be more appropriate to say, standards required "by" the bill, rather than required "in" the bill. So this amendment would strike the word "in" and substitute the two words "required by." Before I proceed, I would like to ask Senator Langemeier a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Langemeier, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Langemeier, have you had the opportunity to review this proposed amendment?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I have.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you had the opportunity to discuss it with your staff?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I have not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Have you had the opportunity to discuss it with any representatives of the profession?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I have not.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Langemeier, are you telling me that you think you're capable on your own of evaluating this amendment and determining whether it's appropriate or not?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I think I can.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you have an opinion as to the appropriateness of this amendment?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I would accept the appropriateness of this amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Langemeier. What an easy
