SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Langemeier, what is the difference, in your mind, between...let me get the language itself...between "related to the qualifications" and "substantially related"? What role does that word "substantially" play?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: I don't know the mind-set when that was put into law in the past. Does it have a significant difference? I think it could be stricken as you've requested.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And since I've taken time on the other amendments, since Senator Langemeier agrees with this one, I will not take any more time. But I'm going to state once again, so anybody who may have missed it will know what the amendment does. On page 69, in line 4, I would strike and show as stricken the word "substantially." Thank you, Mr. President.
