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they probably could not get that done by that time, and I appreciate your cooperation on that.

SENATOR PREISTER: And, Senator, Senator Beutler brought up the fact, as we have discussed, that this will apply to any racetrack in any future applications similarly situated, so perhaps on Select File, rather than waiting till next year, as we had talked about, we could put in a date or structure an amendment in such a way that the plan wouldn't have to be approved for this track, but for all...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR PREISTER: ...future ones would need to be approved prior to the application. And that's something that hopefully we can discuss between now and Select File?

SENATOR BURLING: I would be open to that, yes.

SENATOR PREISTER: Okay. Thank you very much, Senator Burling.

SENATOR BURLING: Thank you.

SENATOR PREISTER: And I appreciate Senator Burling's willingness to work on this and the developer of the track, who is in a difficult situation. I am supportive of the bill. I supported the E clause and I'm supporting Senator Burling's amendment, which he was gracious enough to consent to. With that, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Preister. Further discussion? Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Schrock.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I wanted to wait until Senator Burling had gotten his amendment adopted so the bill is in the shape he wants, and others can still comment on the bill, but I have to get my comments into the record and I wanted to do it on a bill where there is no controversy. I was talking about a kangaroo court, and people have heard that term without being aware of where it came from or why it applies to courts. It relates to a court which has
