CLERK: General Affairs Committee reports on two appointments to the State Electrical Board, Mr. President. (Legislative Journal page 567.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, Chairman of the General Affairs Committee, you're recognized to open.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Last Monday, the 6th of February, the General Legislature. Affairs Committee met and ... for the appointment of, to the State Electrical Board, two members. The first reappointment, Mr. Edwin Bergstraesser of Lincoln. He has worked in the field since his high school graduation. He became an electrical inspector in 1993. Currently, he is the chief inspector of Lincoln. He is an electrical expert and has been asked to testify in district court level on many cases involving litigation about electrical facilities. And he contributes to the National Electrical Code, and I believe he would be a very good reappointment to that board. The second one is Mr. Cory Mueller. He is from Seward, and he is a new appointment. has an MBA from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln, has work experience with many electrical contractors, spent five years in an electrical apprenticeship program, and became a foreman. He is currently employed as an electrical contractor. So I would ask for the confirmation of these two gentlemen to the State Electrical Board. Thank you.
