SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Further discussion, advancement of LB 1111? Seeing no lights on, Senator Janssen, you're recognized to close.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback. I will close. I believe the amendment that Senator Chambers has brought forth to us does clear up the language a little bit. It was a little inconsistent. I think that this is an important commission we must have. The responsibilities are quite extensive. They are dealing with several people's livelihood, and so on, so forth. And I believe that they should be...come before the prospective committees, whoever they are, and get confirmation through those committees. We...you know, you could find something that the Governor doesn't know about in his appointments. Not that this is going to happen, but I think that's the way it should be.
