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instead of having the words "engaged in business," I'm going to strike "engaged in" and substitute the word "doing," so it has these companies "doing business in." Are you familiar with the initials or letters DBA in a business context?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what do those initials or letters stand for?

SENATOR JENSEN: Doing business as.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if I would use the word "doing," that is in line with the way this kind of idea is expressed already, rather than "engaged in."

SENATOR JENSEN: I would think so. I haven't read that thoroughly.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, but you...

SENATOR JENSEN: It would seem appropriate to me, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now the other day, you and I were talking about the spelling of the word "annually," and I probably took...put you in an unfair situation, so I'm going to give you a chance to redeem yourself. Are you ready?

SENATOR JENSEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. If you will, spell the word "cop."

SENATOR JENSEN: Cop?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Cop.

SENATOR JENSEN: C-a-p?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Cop. You know, like a police officer.

SENATOR JENSEN: Oh, (laugh) c-o-p.
