it, and it's gone. They take the \$25. They're no duplicate of them or anything.

SENATOR HUDKINS: That's right. That's the problem.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: So how are we trying to solve this, then? You're trying to solve this with this bill?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yes, we are. And the only way that there would be a record of that is if the business, in fact, did turn it over to the Treasurer's Office.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: If the business, at the end of the year, they said, you know, all of these numbered certificates have not been turned in yet. Yeah. So...

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yeah, yes.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...that is a concern that is...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: One minute.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: ...that's a concern that I have and that's a concern that I have with people that purchase them, with that expiration date on, and they throw them away. The business establish (sic) has the money already; they've got the money. They've never had to serve anything. They've never had anybody get anything for those \$25. And when they put that expiration date on it, you know, they're hoping that they get utilized, but yet they're also thinking, if they're not utilized, I got \$25 for not giving them anything, only a sheet of paper.

SENATOR HUDKINS: And again, that's why this bill came into being, was to eliminate that problem.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay, thank you, and I truly support this. I'll give the balance...(microphone malfunction).

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Senator Stuthman and Senator Hudkins. Senator Redfield, you are next in line to speak.
