dead. It will never be claimed. And what was the normal rule for every other property in this state, which is that it escheats to the state, is making an exception here, and the exception is the merchant gets to keep this. Is it like cash? Well, by the way, there's big distinction...

SENATOR CUDABACK PRESIDING

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LANDIS: ...between cash and everything else. Under the common law, cash could not be abandoned property. Cash couldn't be abandoned property. Why? Because no one, it would assume, would abandon cash. They might assumed an old piece of junk; that they might abandon, but not cash. No one ever gives up cash, according to the law, and it isn't abandoned property. Treating a certificate like this like cash is a fiction, and it's not true. That is not an appropriate analogy to make, and if there's a justification I want to hear it, for why the merchant should keep the money from this, rather than it ultimately, at some point, some reasonable point, going to the state, like all other abandoned property. I want to hear it, and I haven't heard it yet.
