SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening on FA431. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers, there are no lights on. Did you wish to...Senator Chambers waives closing. The question before the body is, shall FA431 be adopted to the committee amendments? All in favor vote aye; opposed, nay. The question before the body is the Chambers amendment, FA431, which amends the committee amendments to LB 173. Have you all voted on the question who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Chambers' amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Chambers amendment has been adopted. Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: Senator Chambers, I now have FA432. (Legislative Journal page 607.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. This time, Mr. President, I was going to get ahead of myself and start explaining the amendment, even before the Clerk announced that we were ready for it. I'm offering this amendment, because I don't really understand the language that I'm amending. There is new language on page 4, beginning in line 24, and it simply duplicates language in existing law. And I'm going to read that language as it appears in existing law: "All tangible personal property, not otherwise covered by the Uniform Disposition of Unclaimed Property Act, including any income or increment thereon and deducting any lawful charges." Does that mean after deducting any lawful charges? So I will ask, Senator Bourne, have you looked at this language?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Bourne, would you respond?

SENATOR BOURNE: Well, Senator Chambers, yes, I will respond.
