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Legislature to create this kind of a law, and to determine who and when and under what conditions they may use it. I think that's sufficient. You'd find it in the green copy of the bill, Senator Beutler, on line 22 of page 2, and on line 3 of page 3, the points that I was making. Thank you, Senator Cudaback.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Landis. Further discussion on the Chambers amendment? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Landis, I want to go back to that discussion. I appreciate the fact that it's not self-executing. With respect to distinguishing...with respect to your intention that it not be self-executing with regard to the types of nonprofits that may benefit from this, what you seem to be saying is that on lines 15 and 16 and the top of page 3, that continuing sentence...I'm sorry, I'm on the wrong page. The bottom of page 2, the top of page 3, particularly line 2 at the top of page 3, where it says "only by nonprofit enterprises as determined by law." So you're saying, with respect to that phrase, that the law we're talking about, first of all, is state law, that we're not talking about the general Nebraska law of nonprofit corporations and saying that anybody that qualifies under that will also qualify under this constitutional amendment, but rather you're saying it's only...this provision can only be used by such nonprofit enterprises as are, subsequent to the adoption of the amendment, determined by the Legislature. Is that right?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, I think that's the operation of the language. And by the way, the clarification of that between the two of us on the floor should make that even more explicit.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much.
