SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what is not being applied to a person in

uniform operating a military vehicle?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Was that a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: Could you restate that for me one more

time?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. This language on page 13, in Section 14, beginning in line 14, says that sections, and then it lists three sections, shall not apply to these uniformed military personnel operating military vehicles. What is not being applied to those military personnel?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: The purpose of that section is to exempt military personnel from driving military equipment, be exempted from providing a Nebraska CDL license if they were stopped. They would have to produce a valid military driver's license, which Nebraska would recognize as the equivalent to the Nebraska CDL license.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Couldn't the ...

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: And that is it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Couldn't the military arrange for the people who are going to drive these vehicles to obtain the appropriate Nebraska license, if there's a fee that has to be paid?

SENATOR LANGEMEIER: The issue that is related to that particular statement would be military personnel that travel in multiple states. And typically, if you're...let's say you're a resident of Kansas per se, and you get called up on active duty and get brought to Nebraska to do some pretraining. Is there time to get a Nebraska CDL for the limited amount of time you may be here, or in another state? We would just comply with the
