SENATOR CHAMBERS: But when they come back here, they're not under the jurisdiction of the federal government. Whenever they're called, you can call it being federalized if you want to, and the federal government is taking charge of them, they are then a part of the U.S. military. Other than that, they're just citizens in the state of Nebraska, but...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the Langemeier amendment? Senator Langemeier, there are...Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I thought I had my light on. I'm just going to make some comments, because this bill is on General File and there will be the opportunity to go into it more on Select File. I don't want to be told that a provision of law is before us because it's required by the federal government to do this to bring the state law into conformity with the federal law, then we find out that parts of that are not required by the federal government and no distinction is made. I want to know. I'm one of those inquiring minds, and so is Senator Mines, and he just confirmed it. He wants to know, too, and others want to know. But if I'm asking the questions, why should all of them have to stand up and pose the same questions? So here's the question I'm going to ask of Senator Baker, and then I'll release him on this as far as questioning him, unless I think of something Senator Baker, what I would like you to do, if you will, else. is determine by comparing the language in Senator Langemeier's amendment with what you say is a federal requirement, and see if every category of persons in Senator Langemeier's amendment is required by that federal regulation to be there. Now here's the question I will ask you. If Nebraska does not adopt this language, has the federal government said they're not going to give funds to the Nebraska National Guard? Because the federal government foots most of the bill for the National Guard.
