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willing to answer, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Flood, would you respond?

SENATOR FLOOD: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Flood, in line 1, on page 6, what is the difference between the director and the department?

SENATOR FLOOD: Well, I believe that the director is part of the department, and I would have to agree that that seems somewhat ambiguous, however, the director is responsible for guiding the ship as far as policy is concerned of the Department of Motor Vehicles, and I would assume that some of this--the Governor obviously guides the entire executive branch of government--maybe we're talking about promulgating rules that would be adopted administratively and maybe the department would be seen differently than the director there.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But in any case...

SENATOR FLOOD: I would be amenable to you, you know, striking the word "director" and just having it be "eliminated by the department."

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And I won't do that right now, because if there is a difference that means something I don't want to strike it, but if there is no difference then I would just want one or the other. So I just wanted your answer on that. And I'm not going to question you with reference to this material at this point, because I'm going to discuss again what I find problematic with material in lines 5 through 14 on page 6. It starts on page 5 (sic), at line 5: Any person who receives notice from the director of action taken of a specified kind shall immediately return such registration certificate and license plates to the department. Without stopping to ask a question, I want to discuss "immediately." Then we continue the next sentence: If any person fails to return the registration certificate and license plates to the department, the department shall forthwith, whatever that means, direct an officer of the Nebraska State Patrol to secure possession thereof.
