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that you're complying with all the rules of the road and the regulations set forth in the administrative code. There is no requirement that that law enforcement officer, with arrest powers, have any probable cause to stop you. Weigh stations, if the light comes on and they're open for business and your truck is summoned into the weigh station, you have no choice to comply with the law at that time. You have no choice but to go into the weigh stations and comply with the orders of the carrier enforcement or State Patrol troopers at that certain weigh station. So there is a difference here and I think it's important that we have that background or context when we look at some of the concerns that Senator Chambers has raised. I do think we should specify, in line 7, on page 6, a certain time frame that they have to return the registration certificate and license plates to the department so as not to create an ambiguous section of statute. Someone's mother may die so, you know, they may have a lot of different reasons and one excuse would be valid and one wouldn't. So I would prefer to say three business days after receipt of the notice, and the reason I say "business days," is I don't want it to affect federal holidays or days when the post office is not open. If you fail to return the certificate and plates to the department within the time period set forth, as amended, should that be amended, what should the department do? I would be in favor of directing the department to notify the Nebraska State Patrol that we have a licensee that is not in compliance with the rules, and allow the Nebraska State Patrol to do its job by enforcing the law of the state of Nebraska in whatever manner it deems necessary. I have a lot of faith in our State Patrol. I think that our troopers will do a good job of addressing any issues...any issues of non-law-abiding citizens brought to their attention. And we can...we can essentially strike the last language, because I do not think that the State Patrol needs to be reminded that they'll make every reasonable effort to enforce our law. I think they do that already. So I think that Senator Chambers has raised some issues in Section 5 of the committee amendment that are cause for concern, but there's a different way to address those issues without simply striking the entire section. Thank you, Mr. President.
