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found a chair and he hopped up on the chair, put his head down, and the judge took that wooden hammer, bam, and hit Burns on the head with it as hard as he could. No response, no reaction, but there was a loud hollow sound that echoed and reverberated, not throughout the courtroom but inside the skull of "Kangaroo" Burns. And they told this "Kangaroo" that this secrecy stuff you're talking about is out the window. What he has done, old "Kangaroo," is to make a travesty of the court system of the concept of justice and has taken positions on an issue which an impartial judge is not to do. I think somebody wrote out a statement for him and said, "Kangaroo," this is what you ought to do, and the "Kangaroo" hopped on it and did it. He has made a shambles of this whole grand jury process and proceeding. I am glad that arguments that I had laid out on the floor were adhered to, and the argument was made that if there is no grand jury proceeding there is nothing which puts "Kangaroo" in a position to make demands on these lawyers and threaten them. And it is also my belief, based on my recollection of some work I had done in this area, that if a judge threatens to cite somebody for criminal...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...contempt, that person can demand a jury trial. I don't know if "Kangaroo" knows that or not, but everything he does creates an additional problem. What the Supreme Court ought to do is suspend him with pay and subject him to a mental competency examination and tell him, if you don't agree to have your head examined, we're going to, by our own motion, file an ethics complaint against you because you are not maintaining competency in the law; you're the lowest rated judge in the state and you're a shame and a disgrace to the profession; you bring the administration of justice into disrepute, and that's enough to get rid of anybody, and certainly a lunkhead such as yourself. And when the Chief Justice got through, you know what "Kangaroo" said? Huh? And looked as blank as a piece...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.
