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"maroon," or is it a macaroon, or is it a moron? He wouldn't know the difference. If I had the right expression on my face and I said, Judge Burns, you are indeed a moron of the first order, he would say, gee, thank you, Senator Chambers; nobody ever said that to me before. That's what you have as judges. No, let me not make that plural. There might be another one like him somewhere in the Nebraska system, but if there is I have not encountered such a person, so I should keep this singular. That's the kind of judge you have sitting on the bench. I'm going to do like that guy named...is his name Popeil or Bopell (phonetic) who does these Ronco commercials, and he tells you, I'm going to give you this knife for \$6.85, and tells you everything it will do. You can cut down trees, you can kill animals and your enemy, but that's not all. There's more. have two meat cleavers and if you use them both at the same time, you can chop your mother-in-law's head off with one swoop. But that ain't all. And they go on and on and on, there's more. Well, there's more to this story: Order regarding hearing on motion for consideration.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This matter comes before the court on the issue of whether the hearing to be conducted on February 10, which is today, 2006, at 3:00 p.m., regarding the motion to reconsider, should be open to the public. This question has not been addressed by the Supreme Court in the writ of mandamus which was issued February 9, 2006. As the Supreme Court pointed out in its orders of February 9, 2006, the Nebraska Attorney General has made public the order of February 3, 2006, by filing...by his filing with the Nebraska Supreme Court. Consequently, any arguments that will be made which might impact the grand jury, should this court grant the motion, will not further adversely impact the grand jury. Did you see that? Does that sentence resonate with you? I'm going to read it again: Consequently, any arguments that will be made which might impact the grand jury ...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh.
