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looked at by some people as though something is wrong with them, and the man is nowhere to be seen. Sometimes the man will say, well. I've got all these children and all these grandchildren, as though he did something other than that pop of the finger participation. You know why they call those people during the Revolutionary period Minutemen, don't you? That's why they called them Minutemen, and then they were giving them 40 seconds extra. That's like saying they so dumb I want you to spell cat and I'll spot you the first two letters, and he still can't spell it. Then he's the one who's macho. He's the one Mister Big, Mister Strong, Mister Powerful, and all of these depictions on television, these videos, are the sexual fantasies of inadequate, insecure men who, in the real world, cannot do what they ought to do as the men that they try to project themselves as being. Why in the world are they going to dress some man up in a tuxedo and send him over to Hawaii and have these women I saw one of these and looking goo-goo-eyed, giggling? turned my stomach. If the television wasn't mine and it would have cost me, I was going to pick up one of my plates of my weight and throw it through the television screen. Then I remembered that this is on me. But it was disgusting. And he was a doctor, but he was as dumb as a post.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When he talked, he sounded like an adolescent. Then there's all these women twittering and giggling about, ooh, I hope he accepts me. Well, what have you got that's going to make him accept you? Well, this...he was down...he came from Georgia and I come from Georgia. And then another will say, well, I lived in Mississippi, which is somewhere close. I meant, talking the craziest, most inane, asinine stuff you ever heard. But that is the way women are to be portrayed and I think they make sure, when they herd these women together, they get those kind of foolish people so that the stereotype is maintained intact, just like when they put black people on television and in movies. They put the ones we call the Uncle Toms, the clowns, the buffoons, the Aunt Jemimas, the degraders, the debasers, the abasers. Those are the ones they select and those are the ones they put forth, because some people will do anything for money. Thank you, Mr. President.
