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this, Senator, but it actually comes under the purview of the Nebraska Emergency Management Agency. And it is the commission that appoints, supervises, and coordinates the activities of local emergency planning committees, under the Nebraska...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: ... Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act for hazardous materials. And it includes very specific kinds of requirements for those commission members. For instance, director of Environmental Quality, director of Health and Human Services Regulation and Licensure, director of the Department of Roads, et cetera, et cetera. And it looks as if...well, I think it's probably close to 19, and I'll have to count, but a number of people serve on this commission.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But the point is, they do carry out some specified functions.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, they do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are they subject to that...whatever that agency is that you mentioned? Or does...?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: The Nebraska Emergency Management Agency, or NEMA.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, does that agency...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: It's the state...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...work under the umbrella of the commission, or is the commission under that agency?

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I believe that...

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.
