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automotive petroleum industry. He appeared before the committee on February 9 for his confirmation. He earned his bachelor's degree from Kansas State University, and we shouldn't hold that against him, and is president of the Whitehead Oil Company. He has served on the board of the Cornhusker Council of the Boy Scouts of America, Husker Power Club, Heartland Big Brothers and Sisters, Lions Club, Phillips 66 national marketing advisory board, and the Chamber of Commerce. The committee vote was 7 for and 1 was absent. And I would encourage you to vote for Mark Whitehead for reappointment to the Environmental Quality Council.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Chairperson Schrock. You've heard the opening on the report by the Natural Resources Committee. Open for discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, as Senator Schrock read off that list, all I could say inside was, wow. So I have to ask Senator Schrock a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, is this a reappointment, did you say?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, it is, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When does Mr. Whitehead find time to do whatever he's being appointed to, with all those other duties and activities that you read off?

SENATOR SCHROCK: You know, a wise man once told me, if you want to get something done, ask a busy man.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll accept that. Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Schrock.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion on the first report, Natural Resources Committee? Seeing no lights on, Senator Schrock, you're recognized to close.
