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SENATOR BURLING: Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to have to talk to the Clerk...

SENATOR BURLING: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...at some point. If they're doing double duty in the Bill Room, then they're going to get double pay. You...would you like to amend that reference? You're getting coaching from the peanut gallery.

SENATOR BURLING: Yeah, I hear them. Yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. You meant Bill Drafter, right?

SENATOR BURLING: Bill Drafters, fine, yeah.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. I'm just having a little fun. Senator Burling, in line 3 we have the word "using" tires. In line 12 we have the word...the two words "use tires," meaning that you make use of them. Then in line 10 we have the word "needed." So here's what my amendment would do. When you're talking about line 10, which says "disposal of tires which cease to be needed as safety barriers," I would strike "needed" and insert the word "used," because we have consistency then. We're talking about tires which cease to be used as safety barriers. And here's why I say it. If you simply have the word "needed," there would not necessarily be a use of the tires for that purpose. The one operating this facility would simply say, I need them, and so I'm going to just indefinitely keep them positioned here; although I'm not using them right now, I need them. I want to make sure that as soon as the use of these tires for this purpose ends, then these tires have to be disposed of. And I would give you an opportunity on my time to respond to that, by way of me asking you this question. Do you have a problem with my amendment?

SENATOR BURLING: I think it's a good addition, Senator Chambers. I support it.
