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SENATOR SCHROCK: No, we're not going to give them money. They're going to have to apply for a grant and only after all the educational grants are fulfilled and...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A grant means not a loan, but money that's given without strings attached.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Right.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Once you get it, you don't have to pay it back. Isn't that true?

SENATOR SCHROCK: That is correct. And we've given a lot of grant money away and it hasn't done much good, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Schrock, thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Burling a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling, would you...Senator Burling, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Burling.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Burling.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like to ask you a question, if you...or maybe two.

SENATOR BURLING: Thank you. Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Burling, do you think that a rhinoceros could carry a gazelle on its back?

SENATOR BURLING: I suppose.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you think a gazelle could carry a rhinoceros on its back?

SENATOR BURLING: Not very far.
