other states like Florida are very active in their state legislatures, having standing committees for military affairs, in the case of Florida, in an effort to recapture some of the space industry business already lost to other states. Other rural states like North Dakota, Montana, Alabama, have developed strategic plans and actively lobby in Washington, D.C. their legislature for their military bases. What my point is, is we can make a difference.
