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that would do is pin down the point at which the qualifications for receiving this exemption would be determined. When I do this, I don't always explain why, but I'm going to this time. The Legislature is the only body under the Nebraska Constitution authorized to legislate for this state. Numerous decisions by the Nebraska Supreme Court have established the principle that the Legislature cannot delegate the authority given to it by the constitution to any other individual, group, or collection of individuals or groups. Legislating is the exclusive province of the Legislature. The Legislature is not prohibited from incorporating federal rules, regulations, statutes into Nebraska law by reference, but if all it does is mention whatever the provisions are without more, that would be an unconstitutional delegation of the Legislature's authority. Because every time Congress would amend or change whatever the rule, regulation or statute was that we referenced, it would mean that Nebraska's law would be changed automatically, which would be saying that Congress has been empowered to legislate for Nebraska by amending Nebraska law every time it amended the rule or regulation or statute that had been referenced. But the court has also made it clear that if when we incorporate by reference a federal piece of legislation and assign a specific date, that is all right because nothing that Congress would do in the future would change Nebraska's law automatically. And as ironic or anomalous as it may seem, if Congress repealed that provision, it would still be a part of Nebraska law because a person would look at what that statute was, prior to its having been repealed, on the date that it was incorporated into Nebraska law. So whenever, by reference, a federal provision is incorporated into Nebraska law, a specific date should be assigned, and that's what I'm doing with Senator Cornett's bill. I could have just left it alone, let the bill go to cloture, take the vote, let it go ahead and be enacted by the Legislature. The Governor doesn't pay attention, senators don't pay attention, and a fatal flaw would exist in her bill and it could not be implemented. Some people I will do that to, perhaps, but I'm not going to do it in this instance because Senator Cornett has been willing to discuss any and all aspects of her bill, accept amendments, and I should not have done as much work on her bill as I have done. I really should not have. I don't like this bill. I don't like what it's doing. I think
