SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BEUTLER: ...a Campaign Limitation Finance Act which was very difficult to avoid even under current circumstances, as is demonstrated by Mr. Hergert's dilemma, will be well near impossible to sidestep with these new rules in place. But I think it does it without...with a very minimum of additional paperwork or regulatory authority. We were very conscious of that as we went through it. And really, the only additional burden, to the extent that there's additional burden, is on the nonabider. So with that, Senator Cudaback, I hope I've explained fairly clearly what the important parts of the amendment are, and I will abide my next opportunity to speak. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. You've heard the opening on the Beutler amendment, AM2270 to the committee amendments to LB 188. Open for discussion on that. Senator Brashear, followed by Senators Smith, Schimek, Beutler, and Erdman. Senator Brashear.
