advantages. We know in the school aid formula that some students come to school, starting there in kindergarten, and they have some disadvantages from their home. Perhaps it's a physical disadvantage, perhaps it is a social disadvantage, or a monetary disadvantage. And we know that the same amount of dollars does not provide them with the same opportunity in the schools. And campaign finances are very much like that, because in fact the incumbent does have the advantage of name recognition. I have had my name quoted in the newspaper. I've actually been given credit for bills that Senator Brown has introduced. (Laugh) It was an error, but my name was in the paper. And someone who would want to challenge me in a race has to overcome that name recognition. How? Well, it might be by spending more money. And yet our laws actually create a burden that I don't know is fair. And I've often wondered as I've presented to students, when we've talked about this law, whether in fact it would be possible for someone in a wheelchair in America to run under our campaign finance limitations, because of the disadvantage they would have in not being able to go out and knock on doors and show up at meetings like you and I can when we're in good health. Someone with a heart condition, who couldn't put in those kinds of grueling hours, how would they overcome this disadvantage, a physical disadvantage? They would have to do it by spending more, by putting out their ideas and where they stand in print and in the other media. So equal does not always mean equal. Now, expenses. If you're an incumbent, you know that we are required to use campaign funds if we want to purchase our hometown newspaper, or if we want to have a fax in our office and a dedicated phone line for that fax machine, or if you want to survey the residents in your district. Those are put down and reported as actually campaign expenses, even though those are things that only allow us to do our jobs better. So even in our reporting, equal isn't equal, in the sense of what we're spending for a campaign. Now, in background, I have always abided by this campaign finance limitations. I can't fathom,...
