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group of good and decent people, and the staff are good and decent people, but they're not perfect. I haven't found them to be angry or difficult or anything else, but it isn't a skip in the park to deal with them, and sometimes they're a little slow. I circulated among all of you, as a matter of public record, the complaint I filed. You see, we've got a slight difference here. Senator Schrock had told me, long before any of the Hergert-Blank issues arose, that he didn't like my friend and client Dave Hergert. Well, I do. What I didn't say to him back was that I'm not particularly fond of his friend, Don Blank. So I filed a complaint against Don Blank, for doing the same thing in the same month as Senator...as Dave Hergert, that Chris Beutler had alleged was wrong. I'm still waiting and waiting and waiting. Every month I get a letter that says, still pending, still pending, still pending. What happened to justice delayed being justice denied? Who's trying...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...to orchestrate what? I wonder if it wouldn't...I can...I can't make myself judge and jury. I can pretend to be judge and jury and say, I don't like it when people do thus and so. Well, I'm saying there's unequal treatment under the law here, and I'm sorry, I didn't bring it up, somebody else did. And what's fair is...what's fair for one is fair for the other, and I'm going to deal with the facts and quit acting like we've got all the facts, because we don't. And if I knew if anything else was going on, I couldn't tell you, because there's a prohibition...see, it's a secret proceeding. We must be in North Korea. But the Blank complaint is still pending. Senator Schrock ought to do what he ought to do, and I'm doing to do what I ought to do, and then let's get off of that. But I'm not going to stand before you as if...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: ...I'm judge and jury and I'll make the decision. Who appointed who to do what, when?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Brashear.
