follow. He draws conclusions without having evidence to support them. It's one thing to cite a case and have the case stand for the purpose that it's cited for, and another just to cite it to make it appear that you have something going. What some people are not aware of is that even if a grand jury is impaneled, the prosecutor doesn't have to wait for the grand jury to arrive at any conclusion. And if they read the existing law, they would know. Section 29-1402 says, "The convening of a grand jury shall in no way limit the right of prosecution on information or complaint during the time the grand jury is in session." Even while a grand jury is in session, the prosecutor can file charges, even while it's in session. So if this kangaroo has vacated the order to convene a grand jury, that in no way impinges on the power, and in this case I feel the duty, of the Attorney General to go forward and file charges. This is not going to go away. Even the kangaroo in his order had suggested that he's not saying charges cannot be filed. He wanted to protect himself by saying that all of his conclusions, all of his reasoning, all of his writing, was in connection with whether or not a grand jury should be convened, not that there was no basis aside from those grand jury proceedings. So I don't know what people were talking about on the floor this morning, but I wanted to be sure and get that into the record. Senator Brashear knows that his effort is doomed, and it ought to be doomed, and my vote is going to help doom it. Where is Senator Brashear? Is he still on the floor?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Right behind you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. This is dedicated to Senator Brashear, as far as what he's doing. (Singing) It's the wrong time, and the wrong place.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And on that basis, he is doomed. Thank you, Mr. President.
