SENATOR KREMER: I would think that would be an egg that's in the development stage of becoming a chicken.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I agree. Would you accept an amendment which says "Hatching eggs means unborn chicken"? Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Well, I'm trying to think through that. I don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, it is a fertilized egg. Is that true?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes, it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And it's on the way to becoming a chicken. It's at a stage of development on the way to becoming a full-fledged chicken. Is that right?

SENATOR KREMER: I would say yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kremer, you've supported Senator Foley's bill that...

SENATOR KREMER: I...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...refers to an embryo or a zygote as an unborn child, don't you?

SENATOR KREMER: I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then would you support an amendment that says "Hatching eggs means unborn chick"?

SENATOR KREMER: Well, I think that's what it does mean, but I think it's clear in the definition here that that's what it is.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, if I offer that amendment, would you oppose it?

SENATOR KREMER: No.
