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SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. As I was looking over Senator Chambers' amendment here, I don't believe I can support it because I think when you put this in the statutes it would cloud the issue considerably, because he has it'd be...means an unborn chick. And when you look at the description of the poultry in here, you have turkeys and ostriches and other forms of poultry in there, and your geese and your goslings and your water fowl, so chicks are usually considered more with chickens, but when you get into your turkeys, those are usually called poults. I think your geese are goslings and your ducks are ducklings and that sort of thing. So I think this would probably make it something in the statutes that would probably be hard to clarify if it ever came to that point that you had to decide on what kind of egg someone was bringing in to try and hatch. Whether you're bringing in eggs that are just fertilized or whether you're bringing in eggs that have started the incubation period, this is what it's all about, is something so that the Department of Agriculture can have a control on these methods. And so I think it needs to be defined quite clearly what we're talking about. So when you put in, Senator Chambers, I don't know if he realized it or not, but when he put in just chicks, that would make it unclear. It would be mostly with just chickens and it would leave other questions on other kinds of eggs from other poultry that would be in question. So I, myself, can't support this and I would like to have Senator Chambers perhaps reconsider his motion. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. There are...anybody else wishing to address the Chambers amendment? There are no lights on at the moment. Senator Hudkins.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Thank you, Mr. President and members. Senator Chambers, I cannot support your amendment either because chicks are not born, they're hatched. Thank you, Mr. President.
