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SENATOR LOUDEN: Well, yeah, I know it says that in the bill. But are they from Australia or are they from South America?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: They probably migrate one way or another, and they're not restricted to one particular geographical area, because we even have some in Nebraska now and those that are birthed from those in Nebraska, would be considered Nebraska critters.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: This is Senator Chambers' time, Senator Louden. Senator Chambers, you may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the point that I'm making still holds true, despite the corrective comment made by Senator Hudkins. I'd like to ask Senator Hudkins a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Hudkins, would you respond?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Hudkins, you pointed out that these creatures are not born, but that they are hatched. Is that correct?

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What does "hatched" mean? And I'm not trying to be tricky, but just for the sake of the discussion, so that I may be able to address your concerns.

SENATOR HUDKINS: To me, "hatched" means coming out of an egg.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do human beings come out of an egg?

SENATOR HUDKINS: An egg shell.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So any creature which does not come out of an egg shell is born, but any which comes out of a shell is
