SENATOR HUDKINS: There probably are some other varieties which I cannot...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But in general, that's the distinction that you're making.

SENATOR HUDKINS: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And I'm accepting that. Thank you, Senator Hudkins. When we are dealing with what the law calls "terms of art," words take on a specific meaning in the context of the subject being discussed. Many bills that we offer will have a definitional section and, generally, it is introduced with the words "for purposes of this act," or "purposes of this section..."

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...these words mean," and then you give the definitions. And sometimes they are different from the meaning of the word used in ordinary everyday parlance. For example, when most people use the word "person," they don't think of a business entity, a corporation, a partnership and all of the other things which, based on a statutory definition, that word would include. So in order to get away from a misunderstanding of what this amendment would mean, I will simply provide a definition of the word "unborn." I believe that my amendment has reached the desk.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: There are no further...
