SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Kremer, would you yield?

SENATOR KREMER: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Kremer, did you say that the term "hatching eggs" appears elsewhere in the bill?

SENATOR KREMER: It did in the original statutes and on line 11 it talks about the definition of a hatching egg, and that's what this is. The Bill Drafters, when we added some new language, then they rearranged everything and put it in alphabetical order, so it got included later on, so it looks like it's new language. It's...the definition of "hatching egg" is old language on page 1, line 11, of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But what I need to be clear on, that definition appears only in one place and that would be where we find it in the committee amendment, because it has been relocated. So there's only one place where that definition would appear if LB 856 is enacted. Is that correct?

SENATOR KREMER: Well, I would guess. I'm not sure. It might...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

SENATOR KREMER: ...appear later, because it's a definition of "hatching egg" because it would probably insinuate that's going to be used later on someplace and has to have a definition.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, the word "hatching egg" would probably be used, but there would be only one place where the definition would be found...

SENATOR KREMER: That...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and that is where it is located and relocated in the committee amendment. I misheard what you said. I thought you were saying that the definition itself appears someplace else and I had never heard of a definition appearing in two locations in the same act.
