SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? There are no further lights on. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on FA449.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Members of the Legislature, as it exists now, this amendment would say that hatching eggs means an unborn chick. You all didn't want to help me correct that reference, so that's what we have, and that's the amendment that is before us, and I'm going to take it to a vote. I'm not going to hound Senator Kremer's bill, and being collegial, I talked to my esteemed colleague, and I don't use that term satirically here, Senator Beutler, because I looked at his amendment, and I'm going to support it. I had said the other day, I've not met a bill I can't amend. I've met few amendments which I could not amend. I've even tried to amend my own. So what is the point? We should not continue putting in the statute the term "unborn child." On the one hand, people want to stand on this floor and quote, selectively, from books on embryology. They want to give an appearance of scientific accuracy to what they're saying. Then they want to take that big leap from science to religious mumbo jumbo and substitute the term "unborn child," when what they're talking about is either a zygote, an embryo, or a fetus. That's how they mix these concepts, but when religion is abroad in the land, you can expect, if not outright insanity, irrationality. And that's what rules on this floor, when you have bills like the one of Senator Foley's that we're going to spend a lot of time on. And you can thank him for getting rid of any consent calendar in these last few days. So if you had some bills you thought were innocuous and you were going to get them across the board, forget it. "ABC" Combs has another one of those bad bills. I'm not going to be collegial and nice and say, well, I'll let that go and let other bills go. No. I didn't intend
