It's these "Chrishians," these religious people, and these gods who don't keep their word. So this morning, in complying with the integrity, character, and honor of the devil, my view is that a deal having been made must be kept, and that related to an agreement I had made with Senator Kremer about him taking certain steps and I would leave his bill alone. I added: Senator Kremer has done his part; I'm going to do my part. I will have nothing further to say on this bill or impede its movement and so forth. Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Kremer, and Satan love you. Who's breaking the deal now? Senator Brashear. When the people came for that convention center, they said that's all that they wanted, and I handed you articles, and I underlined again and again where they said the convention center, the convention center, the convention center, and you swallowed it, collectively. Now, since that deal had been struck, they ought to stick with that deal. But they don't have to, because they're dealing with dumbbells. They're dealing with macaroons, with maroons, with nincompoops, with spineless, weak people. So what if a deal was made? Deals are made to be broken. You need to deal with me, the devil, moi, Satan, Lucifer. I accept all of those designations, because every time you see one of those in operation, and it can only be done through the works of the "literer," those who write literature, because none of them have seen or talked to this person. He always delivers. Make a deal, but he makes you keep your end of it, and that's where the problem comes in. But nobody has ever written anything in literature where Satan or his representative did not keep his part of the deal, and more than that, deliver on his first. He always said, like the lawyers who operate on a contingent fee basis, if I don't win anything...if you don't win anything, I get nothing. Satan always has said, I will deliver first. If I don't keep my word, you're out from under this, but I'm going to keep my word. Then you've got to pay. And he keeps his word. Then those who made the deal don't want to pay. So here I am, the one they often call the devil, making a plea that people keep their word and not break the deal. But I know what happens around here. So we have a bill before us today, with the same kind of grandiose promises about how much good is going to
