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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to have to find out if it still fits, because I've been working on a different amendment to this bill. May I ask...I'm going to take my time on the amendment, so it's running. May I ask a question of Senator Flood, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Yes, you may. Senator Flood, would you yield?

SENATOR FLOOD: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Flood, this is a very inconsequential amendment that I have. Would it still fit into the bill at the reference points in the amendment, as it's drafted?

SENATOR FLOOD: Let me take a look at your amendment real quick. I believe that the amendment that you have on file, if I recall correctly, was addressing the Section 5 of the bill, sub (3), where we talked about what would happen if somebody didn't comply with the law and their license and their plates had been revoked pending the check being cured. We've put together an amendment in AM2348 that I believe addresses the concerns that you had that were...that are represented in your amendment, if that makes sense. So I think...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I have a different amendment which says, on page 8, line 12, strike the word "over" and show as stricken, and insert "older than." It's one of those where it's correcting a bit of language. So would you look at page 8 of what you have.

SENATOR FLOOD: Okay.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And would you look in line 12, which would be existing language. Do you see, on line 12 in page 8, anything that relates to age?

SENATOR FLOOD: Let's see, no, you're amending...let me get my bearings here.
