It's a good program, and we should allow the people in this state to participate, and that's what this bill is about.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. You've heard the closing on AM2353. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor of the motion vote aye; opposed vote nay. The question before the body is the Schrock amendment, AM2353, which is an amendment to LB 872. Have you all voted on the question who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 37 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Schrock's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Schrock amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Senator Flood, for a motion, please. I'm sorry. Senator Chambers, your light...Senator Flood, you'll make the motion first, and then we'll discuss it. Senator Flood.

SENATOR FLOOD: Mr. President, I move the advancement of LB 872 to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the motion. Now open for discussion. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I didn't comment on the amendment, because my concern goes beyond that, or my interest, let me say. Senator Schrock, you said what this bill is aimed at is mercury. That's the substance.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Does this mean that one who emits a lot of mercury can work with somebody who emits a small amount or none, and purchase the right from that low emitter to emit larger amounts than the high emitter would be allowed to do, on his or
