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SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Schrock, and this will be your third time, Senator.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes. And, Senator Chambers, I think you've had your third time. Is that correct? So if you want some of this time, go ahead. I think the debate is productive, so you can have some time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Schrock. And before I ask Senator Schrock more questions, I'd like to explore something with Senator Wehrbein briefly.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, when you mentioned the word "urban," I think you were getting to the point that there are certain developments going on when you're close to an urban area which would prevent you from expanding that much anyway, because of these other factors.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That has not hit with the same force in the western reaches of the state to the extent that it has in the counties where you're mentioning.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: That's true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And are you saying it's your view that that might happen, or that there's just an attitude, independent of the increasing urbanization, which tends to be against allowing expansion of these operations?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. And...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And...oh, go ahead.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The issue is, somewhere, if you believe in livestock or value-added or whatever you call it, there needs to
