SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I'd like to give my time to Senator Chambers at this point. And that's only the second time I've done that in 20 years. (Laughter)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Chambers, almost five minutes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Schrock, what we're really seeing now is that the large ones didn't need to be included anyway, because the 500 number would be relatively inconsequential to them anyway, and if they had to make this modification, they can absorb the cost of it without being allowed to automatically expand beyond what they have now.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But now that we're talking about a lesser number as the size of the critters already a part of the entity we're dealing with, you want that to be 5,000 as the maximum, to limit the size of those we're dealing with, but you still want to say 500 animals...

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I do.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...as an automatic increase.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Yes, I do. Uh-huh.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You won't...

SENATOR SCHROCK: I'd rather 5,000 was a little larger, too, but I'll get along with you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Five thousand is...then they don't need 500, a 500-animal increase.

SENATOR SCHROCK: If they're over 5,000, you're...yeah. I'd rather see the number a little higher than 5,000, but I'll live with 5,000 if that's...
