CLERK: 2 ayes, 8 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to reconsider.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The motion was not successful. Mr. Clerk, next motion.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schrock would move to amend FA485 with AM2423. (Legislative Journal page 764.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Schrock, to open. Senator Schrock.

CLERK: AM2423, Senator.

SENATOR CUDABACK: AM2423.

SENATOR SCHROCK: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this eliminates the provision allowing expansion of 10 percent, so there is a cap on the expansion. So that's what this does. This takes the 10 percent language out of the bill.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening, AM2423, to FA485. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to speak on that amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'm going to make sure that this bill doesn't move this morning. There wouldn't be any need in embarking on another bill which we probably wouldn't complete this morning. And Senator Schrock and I have talked about some matters that probably can be worked out. And one of the things I can mention immediately. Since cattle and dairy cows are the critters that people are really concerned about, all of these other things, the swine, the chickens, the turkeys, the geese, the laying hens, the two turtledoves, the five ladies dancing, the twelve lords a leaping, all of those will be stricken, and the bill will deal only with the area where the problem exists.
