Senator Schrock is going to put some specific numbers together. Rather than try to hasten and throw something together this morning, he's going to have the amendment properly drafted. Sometimes it takes many minutes, sometimes hours, sometimes days to get a job done which needs doing and to get it done the best that we can under the circumstances. Contrary to what people want to believe, I do not get everything that I want on this floor. If I got everything I wanted on this floor, everything, the only ones who would be left would be the pages, the staff in the front, and me, and my vote would be weighted, w-e-i-g-h-t-e-d. And I might let Senator Langemeier slip in, because he's been coming along nicely. And my vote would count for 90 percent, and Senator Langemeier's vote would count for 10 percent, but it would only take 60 percent to carry anything that's done, so in any case it would always go my way. And people would see what a wonderful place Nebraska can be. But I know that is not going to happen. So what I have to do is argue, be tenacious, and look beyond the boundaries of the 11th Legislative District. If that was all I looked at, or if, like Lincoln senators, I only looked at what's good for Omaha, as they do for Lincoln, my job would be a lot easier. First of all, I'd have somebody else telling me what to do. I'd be a handle that fits any tool. But that's not the way I operate. Everybody on this floor is free to do it the way he or she thinks it ought to be done, but they're not going to get it done easily when I'm concerned and it goes against my interest. Even the Speaker, he knows I like him, he knows I respect him. The only reason I don't refer to him as the "Silver Fox" now, because he's at a different level and I don't want to seem to diminish his standing as Speaker. But he's going to have to defend Sokol, and so is Senator Landis, because he's carrying the water for them, who would not pay a fine levied against them because they were part of an outfit that was...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...trying to push an amendment to the constitution to limit the power of the Legislature to tax. They let their organization go out of business, then they didn't pay the fine. They don't have enough integrity, they don't have enough in the way of ethics. And these are the kind of people
