will come up first, you can trick these senators into going along with you to cloture, and then you don't have to worry about working with them, because the time will be gone by then. So I think you need to mark well how you vote on things that I have an interest in. I won't leave it unstated; I will say it explicitly. I think Senator Beutler even had a Lincoln bill. He had a bill on endowments. Senator Beutler, I hate that things are the way they are now, but maybe you can talk to your Lincoln colleague, and maybe you can't. But you're from Lincoln. And unlike others, I will tie bills in together. I'm going to show you all that we are indeed politicians. And many of you all will take issues where you've got a lot of help and a lot of company, so you don't have to resort to the tactics that I do. But you need to know that I will resort to them, and they are available to me under the rules that I voted against adopting. And what I'm going to do is get a copy of everybody's priority bill, and I'm going to start drafting amendments. What you all should have done, and it's still not too late, maybe, is to advance either my bill to abolish the death penalty, or advance my bill to prohibit discrimination against people based on sexual orientation. Then you would give me a stake in how the Legislature proceeds. But no, you're going to fix me. Well, you can't fix me without fixing yourself. And I think Senator Raikes ought to just get off the table all that stuff about this Omaha school situation. But I hope he brings it out, because that will give us a lot to talk about for a long time.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And the budget. I've already let Senator Don Pederson know that I'm not going to try to derail anything in the budget that needs to be done, but I'm going to talk a lot about the budget, and a lot of things in the budget. I'm going to take my time and I'm going to take your time. We've only got 30 legislative days left, and if you think that I cannot persevere for 30 days, you will find out that I can and that I will. And there are some bad bills that I want to stop. Senator Foley knows that he's got one. Senator Combs is not here now, but she knows and has known it from the beginning. And Senator Landis knows it. He's got a bill he's carrying for Omaha that I'm going to do everything I can to stop. And there
