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be all right if I discuss what we've agreed to? For those in the body, we have agreed to take out the expansion on everything except for dairy and beef. And what we're saying, if you're 3,000 head on beef or 2,000 head on dairy, you can expand 500 or 350 on the dairy side. If you're between 3,000 and 5,000 head on the beef, you can expand 300. If you're between 2,000 and 3,000 on the dairy, you can expand 210. Right now, that's just scribbled on a piece of paper. And when the bill comes back up, whether it's tomorrow or whatever day it is, we will have that amendment there. I'm protecting the right of the small producer to expand and to spread that cost out amongst more units. And, Senator Chambers, I think you understand that totally, and that's why you've agreed to do this. It's not everything you wanted. I appreciate that. So thank you for your time. I have concluded my remarks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Schrock. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this my third time, Mr. President?

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, I will have a motion that will rescue me from having to let this bill move. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, not only are there some people on this floor that I trust, there are people that I listen to, and there are others that I listen to and I hear. I heard Senator Wehrbein, I heard Senator Schrock, I heard Senator...who's that guy who sits behind Senator Schrock who goes all over everywhere and he can't remember what he's saying half the time, and I don't either, and I can't remember his name? Senator "Shovel," Senator "Shovels," Senator Raikes. I just got an evil eye from Senator Bourne. But when you deal with these kind of issues, I don't think they can be resolved entirely by discussions off the floor. And in many instances, I don't want it resolved in that way. This bill, even with what Senator Schrock and I have agreed to, will take away some of what is called local control. It still is going to allow some expansion under circumstances where people, who very well may be affected negatively, will not have an opportunity to do anything about altering what the county
