commissioners or this county planning commission may do. But as Senator Schrock pointed out, on an issue like this, neither side is going to get everything that it wants, and maybe neither side should get everything that it wants. Even when it comes to big business people, whom, by and large, I consider to be evil, wicked, sinful, and without any redeeming quality, nevertheless, in a capitalistic society, have certain rights, and they cannot be just totally obliterated. So despite my almost knee-jerk reaction of a negative kind to anything that, quote, business, unquote, is trying to get through this Legislature, I will listen to what it is they're seeking, and if there is some validity to it, I'm not totally opposed. But if there is none, then I will be, and that's the case with that bill Senator Landis is bringing. It has nothing to recommend it. But on issues of this kind, where there are different categories of people and operations to be affected, we cannot approach the entire issue and solve it as we should as a Legislature with a meat ax, a meat cleaver, a broadsword, not even with a stiletto. Sometimes you have to cut through bone and gristle, and that may take a meat ax, a meat cleaver, or a broadsword. But then, as you start to filleting or scoring, you can't use those clumsy-type implements. And it's through the taking of time, the sharpening of the issues, and laying out for the public the rationale behind what we do, it is in that way that we discharge our duties as representatives. That is my view, and that is my philosophy.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The public should not always be presented with an accomplished fact. They should be in on the developmental discussion that led to that decision being taken. And I believe Senator Schrock had the opportunity to say everything he needed to say. I've had the opportunity to say everything that I needed to say, and I've taken the opportunity to say more than I really needed to say. But some things just take time, and I'm willing to give the time. And sometimes I will achieve the result that I want; sometimes I won't. Senator Landis may win, he and the "axis of evil" may prevail. But in the process, poor Senator Beutler, Senator Beutler, a man whom I respect and actually have come to like, is going to fall
