SENATOR BEUTLER: ...beef will continue to be at the 500...at the limitations that were agreed upon in...when we were in your office then, right?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Right. For...but only in limited size. If you're a feedlot and you're less than 3,000, you can add 500 units; if you're between 3,000 and 5,000, you can add 300 units; if you're over 5,000, you cannot add without permission of the county board.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. So the most that can be added is how many?

SENATOR SCHROCK: Is 500, and that's only for those facilities under 3,000, and the equivalent on the dairy side.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. Thank you very much. I understand.

SENATOR SCHROCK: And you know, we're willing to take the ducks and the geese, the poultry and the fowl and the pork...swine out of it. Now, if you have one of those operations, you're still guaranteed the permit. You're just not guaranteed any expansion.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Right. Fair enough. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Thank you, Mr. President. I'd be willing to give my time to Senator Chambers, if he would like to use it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President. Thank you, Senator Schimek. Members of the Legislature, as Senator Schrock explained what we've agreed to, there is consideration given to the differing sizes of these operations. In some instances, I would not want to see even some of these so-called small or moderate, whatever that would mean, outfits be given the maximum 500 increase. And as we all recognize from the beginning, the large-scale operations don't need any automatic increase. So
