the owner of a historical vehicle to use a license plate or plates--now this is interesting to some of us, at least, in here--that can be issued a plate by Nebraska in the year corresponding to the model year date of manufacture. And DMV has no problem with this, so long as we follow the rules and regulations. The department must inspect and approve the plate or plates. It allows the department to consult with a recognized car club in determining if the plate corresponds to the model year date of manufacture. So we could have a '37 license plate on a '37 Chevy. Interesting. As I said, these people that came to the hearing are dedicated. If you look at the committee statement, there were no opponents to this and a whole list of good, solid citizens coming in testifying for this. And for the most part, they're older people; I say older, I think Senator Cudaback and I qualify. We're doing these things out there, and it's fun. These cars are judged, and they have to be back to as near perfect condition, original condition as possible. So hence, we've provided in the bill various IDs and requirements and so on, and I'd be glad to answer any questions. I don't think there's much controversy involved with the bill. DMV has signed off on it; in fact, they've been very helpful, very helpful through this process, and we can right a wrong, and in some cases get some titles fixed that right now are so misleading that you wouldn't know what you were buying if you simply got a title for a '92 Chevy, and all of a sudden you realize you'd bought a '37. That's probably not going to happen in reality, but that's the way it is now. I'd be glad to answer any questions on AM1816, I believe it is, yes, on the board. I know Senator Chambers has amendments drafted to the amendments, so we'll let Senator Chambers go from there. Thank you.
