SENATOR JANSSEN: Amendment passes. Next amendment, Senator Chambers, to open on FA490. (Legislative Journal page 776.)

Thank you. SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Janssen is not using as many words as I use, but he's taking more time than I'm taking on my amendments, so I want to let everybody know that we can facilitate the process, if you will listen to the amendment, or not listen to it. But if Senator Cudaback has no objection, it means that the amendment is okay, and I will not speak further on the But when others comment, their comments may not go amendment. to my amendment, so you may want to listen. What this one would do is go to page 2, in line 9: strike the word "meet," m-e-e-t, show as stricken; and insert the words "comply with." Throughout the bill when we're talking about doing something in conformity with the law, we use the term either "comply" or "comply with. instead of saying that what we're talking about, in terms of this title, these terms...the person must "meet" these terms, we would substitute the words "comply with" these terms. That is the amendment, and I ask that you adopt it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: We've heard the opening on FA490. Those wishing to speak? No one has their light on, Senator Chambers. Would you like to close? Waives closing. The question is the FA490. All those in favor please vote aye; those opposed, nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of FA490, Mr. President.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The motion passes. The next amendment is FA491. Senator Chambers, to open.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I don't have a whip to crack, but (hitting sound) that's a reasonable facsimile. If we move with alacrity and pay attention, we can get through my amendments very quickly. This particular one I'm going to withdraw, because I will discuss it with Senator Cudaback and Senator Baker. What it would do, so
