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SENATOR JANSSEN: The amendment passes. Senator Chambers, to open on FA493. (Legislative Journal page 777.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, still on page 2, in line 17, I would strike the word "otherwise." What we have on this line is a list of individuals, and it says in the current language, the owner who is going to dispose of this vehicle is a manufacturer, importer, dealer, or otherwise. I would strike "otherwise" and insert "entity or person." Then it would say manufacturer, importer, dealer, or entity or person. That's it.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You've heard the opening. Those wishing to speak on FA493? I see no lights on. Senator Chambers, to close. Senator Chambers waives closing. The question is the advancement of FA493. All those in favor please vote aye; those opposed, nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of FA493.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The amendment has been adopted. Senator Chambers, to open on FA494.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I am tempted to just let this amendment roll through like the others have, but I can't do that to you. If you were paying attention, I would do it. But again, on page 2, in line 17, where it says "a manufacturer, importer, dealer," I would add "thief," because there are certain members of the light-fingered gentry who are entitled to recognition. And some people, when we're dealing in the realm of used cars, feel that those who hawk these vehicles are very close to being thieves. So I put the word "thief" here. I'm not going to take it to a vote. I will withdraw that amendment.

SENATOR JANSSEN: It is withdrawn, Senator Chambers.

CLERK: FA495, Mr. President.
