CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of FA496.

SENATOR JANSSEN: The motion advances. Senator Chambers, to open on FA497. (Legislative Journal page 778.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This is an attempt to tighten some language and to add a couple of words that will cause it to read more appropriately, in my opinion. The existing language in Senator Cudaback's amendment says this organization has members with expertise in authentic vehicles and so forth. My amendment would add the words "knowledge of and," then after "expertise" I would strike the word "in," i-n, and insert "pertaining to." This is the way the language would then read: Members...this organization has members with knowledge of and expertise pertaining to authentic vehicles and so forth, rather than just saying expertise in. I think this language improves the reading and it tightens it up, and that's what I'm asking you to adopt. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: You've heard the opening on FA497. Anyone wishing to speak to that amendment? Seeing none, Senator Chambers to close. He waives closing. The question is the advancement of FA497. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of FA497.

SENATOR JANSSEN: FA497 advances. Senator Chambers, to open on FA498. (Legislative Journal page 778.)

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. And, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment was just made available this morning, so I have not had a chance to go through all of it.
